


- » Dawley Drive businesses in Winchester benefit from a new commercial business park sign that was installed to help promote these local businesses.

2019 BUDGET




SDG EMS

New Residential Developments

Four new developments are anticipated to start construction in 2020 including:

- » Wellings of Winchester, Adult Lifestyle Community 55+
- » Woods subdivision, Winchester
- » Silver Creek subdivision, Hallville
- » Wylie Creek subdivision, Hallville

Ongoing construction continues at Winchester Meadows, Phase 2 of Drew subdivision in South Mountain and Phase 3 of Cloverdale Estates in Harmony.

To support this growth we are proceeding with the necessary studies to expand and/or upgrade North Dundas' drinking water supply system, the Winchester sewage treatment system and our landfill. Upgrades are currently being made to the Chesterville Lagoon.

MEETING THE Community Needs

- » A cell phone booster was installed in the Joel Steele Community Centre, giving citizens a better cell phone signal in the lobby and the arena stands.
- » New user friendly recreation booking software was implemented making it easier to enroll for recreation programs and book facilities.
- » In response to increased demand for youth baseball improvements were made to the South Mountain ball diamond including repairs to fences, benches and landscaping/sodding. Fresh clay and stone dust were added to other fields, storage sheds were installed at Morgan Field and drainage work was done on Sox Field.
- » An accessible swing was installed at the Morewood Park.
- » Accessible picnic tables were installed in the Morewood Park, South Mountain Playground and Mountain Memorial Park.







SUPPORTING OUR Environment

- » 840 maple saplings and 20 cedar trees were given away at the annual *Local Business Expo*.
- » 10 ironwood trees were planted at the South Mountain Fire Hall.
- » LED lighting was installed at Morgan Field to reduce energy consumption.
- » We partnered with South Nation Conservation Authority, SDG and others to the relaunch the Maple Syrup Education Program at Oschmann Forest in Ormond. Local students and families can enjoy an educational experience focused on demonstrations of maple syrup production, forest ecology and First Nations natural heritage.



NEW SDG LIBRARY Services

» The Library is now offering a whole new suite of services. With the *Library* of *Things* you can learn to play an instrument or borrow a unique piece of equipment. Items that can be requested and sent to the branch of your choice include: acoustic guitars, ukuleles, keyboards, mobile internet hotspots and a zumba gold exercise kit.




