2022 Municipal Election

The next regular municipal election to elect a Mayor, Deputy Mayor, 3 Councillors and 2 English and 2 French School Board Trustees will be held on October 24th. Nomination packages for candidates are available online or at the Township office. Advanced voting via internet and telephone starts October 19th. If you are a resident, owner or tenant of property in North Dundas, a Canadian citizen and 18 years of age or older on election day, you can vote. Building Better Roads


The 2022 budget included significant funds for transportation improvements throughout North Dundas: \$1,080,000 for bridges & culverts, which includes a box culvert on Cayer Road; \$2,199,000 for roadways, which includes Belmeade Road, Marionville Road, Development Road, Wincrest Avenue and Clark Road; and \$35,000 for sidewalk improvements. We appreciate your patience during this construction season.

The Counties' total paving budget for 2022 exceeds \$15 million for various roads throughout SDG. The total bridge rehabilitation budget is more than \$5 million, with the largest project being Ferguson Bridge on County Road 18.



The 2022 Counties total budget is \$66 million. This results in a 2.34 per cent increase for an average residential property in the Counties. Every \$100,000 of assessment in SDG results in \$589 of Counties taxation. In 2022 a typical SDG residential property assessment totals \$222,750, a 0.5 per cent increase compared to one year ago.



The Stay Discover Grow Regional Incentives Program was created in 2018 by the Counties to provide financial incentives to local businesses and non-profits to develop projects that create jobs, increase assessment, and grow our economy. "Businesses and non-profits can apply for grants that cover eligible costs up to \$50,000 per property, per year."
