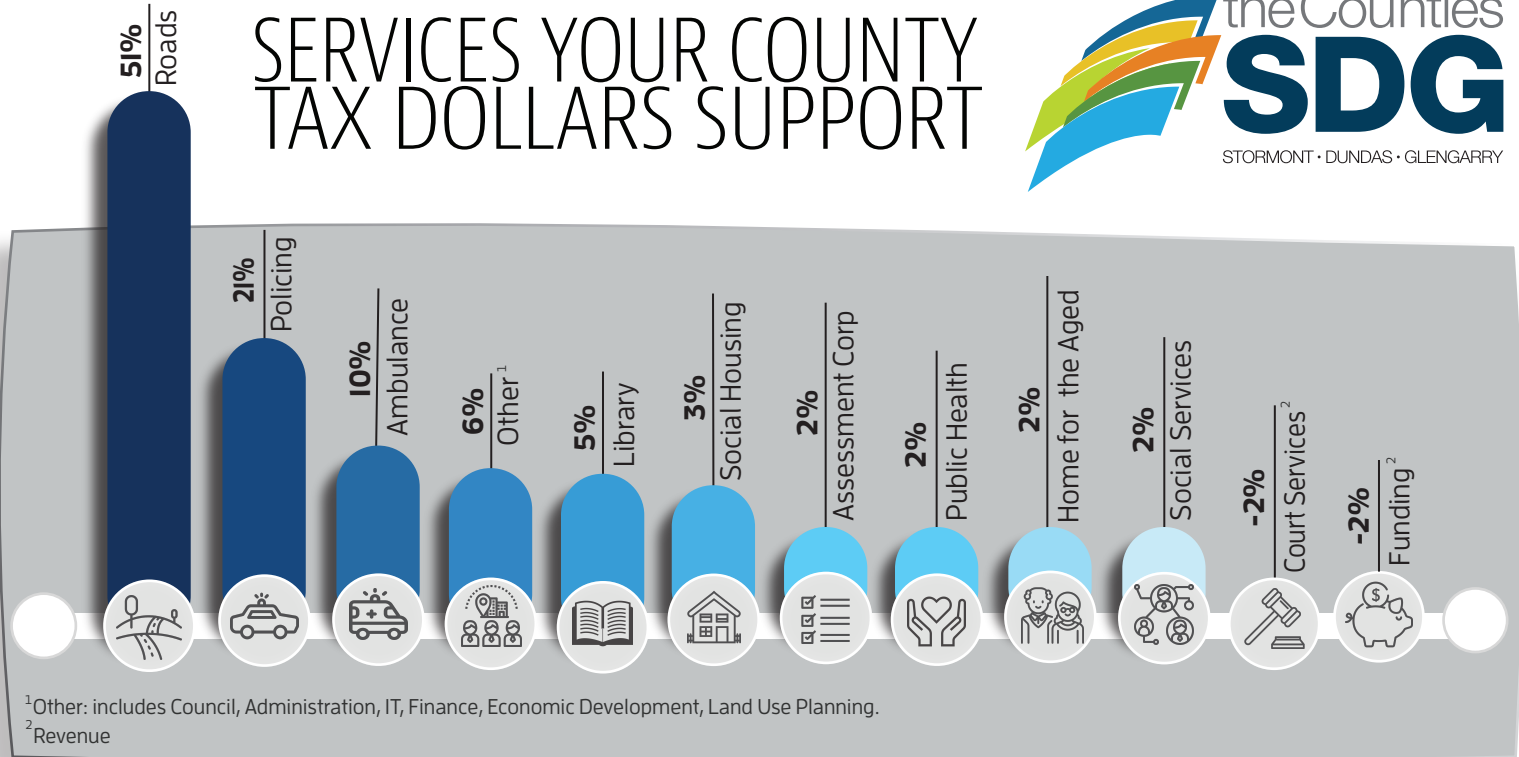

The Stay Discover Grow Regional Incentives Program was created in 2018 by the County to provide financial incentives to local businesses and non-profits to develop projects that create jobs, increase assessment, and grow our economy. 2018 saw 8 grants awarded for a total of \$100,000, and Council has approved \$250,000 in funds for 2019. Businesses and non-profits can apply for grants that cover eligible costs up to \$50,000 per property, per year. In 2019, the County will be spending over \$10,000,000 to rehabilitate roads, about \$2,000,000 to look after its network of 200 bridges, and \$5,500,000 on winter maintenance activities.
