## Township of North Dundas North Dundas Drinking Water Supply System Capacity Expansion Schedule B Class Environmental Assessment


The Township of North Dundas is undertaking a Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) to assess current and future requirements of the North Dundas Drinking Water Supply System to address the reliability and redundancy of the communal water system and the anticipated demand increase due to planned residential expansions and growing industrial needs in Winchester and Chesterville. This study is being conducted according to the requirements of a Schedule B project under the Ontario Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process (October 2000, as amended in 2015)

## **Recommended Alternative**

Following a Public Information Centre (PIC) on December 15, 2022, the preferred servicing alternative was confirmed to be the installation of a new groundwater well on Lafleur Road, as well as seeking supplemental water sources. These sources include continuing investigations for additional well sites, and consideration to connect to the South Dundas Drinking Water system through a watermain along County Road 31. A Schedule 'B' Report has been completed containing details of the proposed upgrades.

By this Notice, the Schedule 'B' Report is being placed on public record for a thirty (30) day review period in accordance with the requirements of the Municipal Class EA process. Interested persons may review this document and provide comments to the Township. Subject to comments received as a result of this Notice, funding opportunities, and the receipt of necessary approvals, the Township may then proceed with the works.

In addition, a request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study (i.e., requiring an individual/comprehensive EA approval before being able to proceed), or that conditions be imposed (e.g., require further studies), only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests should include the requester contact information and full name. Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for conditions or a request for an individual/comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate or remedy potential adverse impacts on Aboriginal and treaty rights, and any information in support of the statements in the request. If there is no request received by **March 16, 2023**, the Schedule B Class EA is deemed complete and valid for a 10-year period. The Municipality could then proceed with implementing the preferred alternative anytime within this 10-year window, as presented in the planning documentation.
