Highlights of the Year

- The Let's Connect North Dundas website was launched as our online community engagement platform.
- Continuous updates were made to Township facilities to meet AODA requirements.
- Work continued at the Hallville Community Park.
- The Van Camp Cenotaph was restored and revitalized, and a rededication ceremony was held on October 22nd.
- The Cayer Road Bridge was completed.
- The Barkley Road Bridge on Nation Valley Road was replaced.
- The reconstruction and widening of Fawcett Road was completed.
- Asphalt paving completed on various roads throughout the Township.
- North Dundas Fire Services continued to successfully meet training requirements.
- The Food Cycler Pilot Program was a success, with participants seeing a decrease of half a bag of garbage per week. 100% of participants plan to continue using the product.
- Completed the Environmental Assessment for the new well site. Once constructed (estimated 2025), the new well site will increase the water supply to both Winchester and Chesterville.
- Completed the Main Street Pumping station project, which increased the capacity from 3 litres/second to 46 litres/second, allowing for further development in Winchester.
- Completed the Main Street Force Main and Gravity Sewer, which will assist in reducing back ups and sewer overflows.
- Dundas Manor obtained their Building Permit and Site Plan Control approval. The sod turning ceremony took place on December 15th.
- The Local Business Expo was relaunched after a 3-year hiatus.
- Wellings of Winchester completed and opened their clubhouse.
