Celebrating Recreation Month

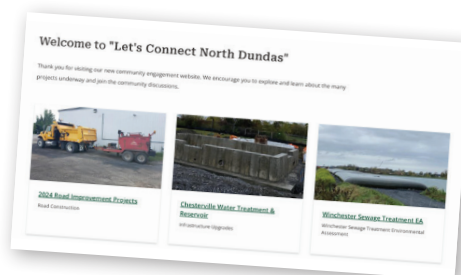

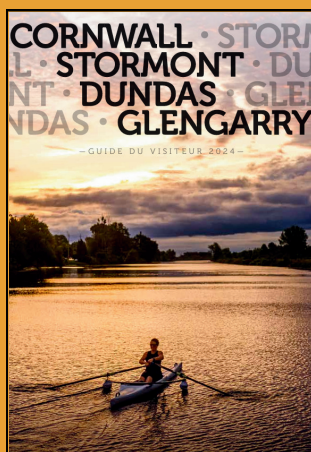
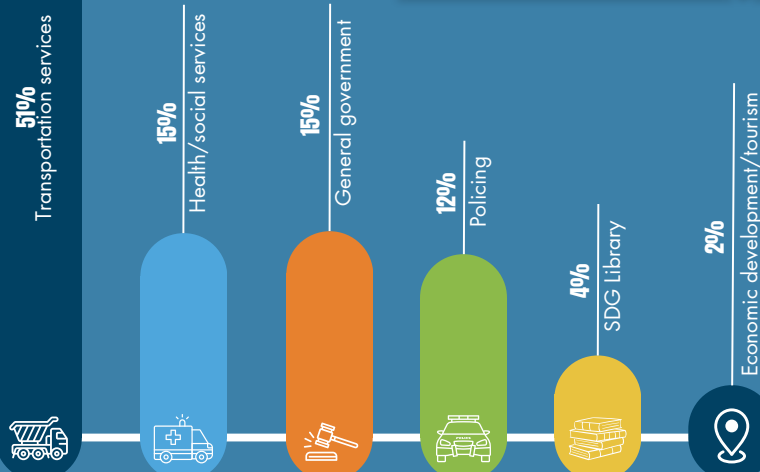

The SDG Counties' total road resurfacing budget for 2024 is \$12.5 million. The total bridge rehabilitation budget is \$5.7 million, including Oak Valley Bridge (\$1.16 million) and Martintown Bridge (\$1.4 million).



The 2024 SDG Counties budget is \$86 million. The budget means a 4.36 per cent increase for an average residential property in SDG Counties. The SDG Counties portion of the taxes for a home valued at \$220,459 will see an increase of \$58.76 for the SDG Counties portion of the tax bill.
